#### **Students Explore America's Ethnic Heritage**

The 6th, 7th and 8th grade students of the Chaney Monge School in Crest Hill, Illinois (near Joliet) are preparing to present a series of ethnic folk dances for the school's **Ethnic Dance Assembly** on Friday morning February 20, 2015 at 9:00am. The 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders will repeat these performances at the school's **Multi-Cultural Fair** that runs on Saturday February 21, 2015 from 10:00am until 1:00pm.

The **Multi-cultural Fair** is the culmination of collaborative research projects where teams of students use resources that include the world-wide-web, libraries, books, magazines, newspapers and family archives to create 50+ booths displaying significant cultural, social, geographic, economic and political information about many of the world's countries and ethnic groups. The Fair is free and open to the public and will feature a variety of hands-on activities for adults and children.

The **Ethnic Dance Assembly** performances are the outcomes of this unique program that provides students with multi-cultural and multi-disciplinary learning experiences, using heritage dances of America's various ethnic groups as a delivery mechanism. The dance program goes beyond traditional dance education for its own sake, as it combines dance with experiential education and healthy exercise and supplements classroom learning across multiple disciplines including history, geography, social studies, mathematics, art, music, health, nutrition and physical education. Students also have the opportunity to provide school and community service by performing what they've learned for school and neighborhood events, retirement communities, etc.
